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





The private club industry is not as specialized in hospitality education as we think, and we are finding that students often lack awareness about our segment of the industry. Thus, the committee is focused on encouraging hospitality students to make the club industry their first choice. Previously within our state, Cal Poly Pomona, San Francisco State, and the University of San Francisco held CMAA charters and represented us within their

hospitality programs. As you can imagine, the events in recent years have detracted from these programs, even leading to the Nor Cal schools not being able to maintain their CMAA charters. Cal Poly is still intact, and we are working with the leadership there to better partner with the student chapter to educate and hopefully integrate these hospitality students into our club worlds as their first choice of career. We hope to gain traction with the



Nor Cal schools very soon and will be looking to Nor Cal clubs for support.

As stated above, our focus is to have a presence with the students, while educating and showcasing the amazing opportunities our clubs can provide. We are currently working with Cal Poly's faculty and student leadership to reignite and create new programs. We are developing an oncampus, in-person private club orientation with education about the club industry. This might take some free pizza—or even better culinary surprises that might whet their appetites for working within clubs—and that is money well spent! The student chapter board members are frequently changing; thus, we will be attending their board meetings once a month to stay connected and assist them in any way possible. We will prioritize the active involvement of students at TGSC events and conferences, as well as the continued development of networking opportunities between students and chapter members.

Current programs we are engaged in include the student chapters in-person club tours (in So-Cal). We hope to create in-person club tours for hospitality students in Nor Cal as well. Another new program being finalized is an online virtual club tour program. This consists of an online club presentation and a virtual tour presented by the club GM to students. Increased productivity because of AI is here today.
